

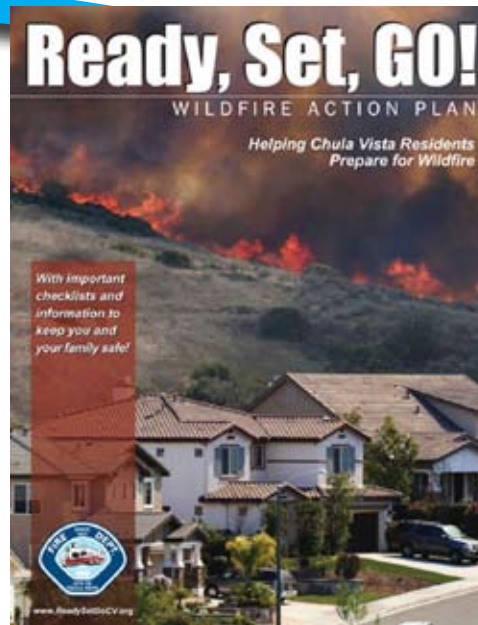

## Ready, Set, GO!

Are you prepared if a wildfire threatens your home? Do you know what precautions to take in advance of an approaching fire? The Chula Vista Fire Department (CVFD) has secured a federal grant to help educate you about one of our greatest threats – wildfires. The \$15,000 Emergency Management Performance Grant is designed to maintain and increase emergency management resources to local governments.

"Ready, Set, GO!" is an effort intended to prepare residents to get "ready" by performing the necessary brush management around their homes; get "set" by creating a personal action plan; and "go" – leave early and not wait on an evacuation order.

The "Ready, Set, GO!" campaign kicks off on June 10 with a variety of outreach efforts. These include Public Service Announcement videos at Chula Vista movie theaters, custom decals on all CVFD vehicles, signage posted throughout the city and a mailer sent to residents in high-risk wildfire areas. ## Passport Service Moves to the Library

Looking to take a trip this summer? Beginning June 9, the Chula Vista Library will be offering passport and photo services Tuesdays through Fridays from 10:15 a.m. to 2:15 p.m. One-stop passport application services are available by appointment at the Civic Center Branch Library located at 365 F Street.

"Summer travel season is here. We are happy to offer this needed service in a customer-friendly location close to home," said Library Director, Betty Waznis.

Applicants must be prepared with the necessary paperwork before they arrive for their appointment. Pick up an application at the Civic Center Library or download the form at [www.travel.state.gov](http://www.travel.state.gov).

Passport Books for adults ages 16 years or older are valid for 10 years. The cost is \$110 (federal fee) plus \$25 to the City of Chula Vista for processing. Passport Books for children 15 years old or younger are valid for five years. The cost is \$80 (federal fee) plus \$25 to the City of Chula Vista for processing. Passport photos are \$15.

## CVPD's New Weapon for Graffiti

The Chula Vista Police Department is aggressively working to reduce graffiti in the city by participating in a newly formed web-based Graffiti Tracker program that focuses on identifying graffiti suspects. When graffiti is discovered, officers take a photograph (known as evidence) and download it to Graffiti Tracker which allows police to monitor, track and hopefully apprehend the suspects. Once caught, the vandals are prosecuted and the City will

seek restitution for **all** tagging recorded by Graffiti Tracker that was committed by that individual.

Graffiti Tracker allows police to more easily prosecute the offenders with the assistance of the San Diego County District Attorney's Office. Since the program began in late March, CVPD has arrested four chronic vandals. Three of the four plead guilty and received probation. The City received restitution for the damages.

## Did You Know...
