Mark your calendar for Chula Vista's big birthday bash on Saturday, October 15 at the Olympic Training Center from noon to 9 p.m. The official Chula Vista Centennial Celebration is open to the public and gate admission is free. ## City Continues to be "Green"



Are you looking for a "cool" place to park your car while visiting the Chula Vista Civic Center? Then check out the new solar carport being installed in the visitors/employee parking lot on the Northern part of the complex. There you will find a 5,900 square foot covered parking structure featuring solar photovoltaic panels.

The new parking area not only provides shade to 36 vehicles, but also produces clean, sustainable electricity for the complex. Over the past year, Chula Vista has installed new solar arrays at 11 sites including recreation centers, the Public Works Yard, the Animal Care Facility and Norman Park Senior Center. These solar photovoltaic systems combined produce enough electricity in one year to power 125 homes.

Funds for the new solar photovoltaic systems have been obtained from federal stimulus grants, California solar rebates, and a low interest loan from the California Energy Commission. These funds are specifically designed to be used for energy saving projects and cannot be used for other services such as police, fire, library and recreation. Electric savings to the city from the new solar panels will cover the cost of the loan within ten years.

## Calling all CAST Members

If you have ever thought about serving your community as a volunteer, consider joining the CAST program. Chula Vista's CAST—Citizen's Adversity Support Team—consists of volunteers trained to provide families of trauma victims with compassionate, supportive assistance.

Volunteers, on call 24 hours a day, every day of the year, are trained by professionals including police officers, firefighters, psychologists, and emergency room staff. First responders summon CAST to a variety

of emergency calls – serious motor vehicle accidents, murders, domestic violence, shootings and fires. Since 1993, CAST members have responded to thousands of calls in the communities of Chula Vista, Bonita, and Imperial Beach.
